Course Syllabus

I. HISTORY

- ullet Ester Delen is a Foreign Language Instructor at the 1st Special Forces Group (A) at the Joint Base Lewis McChord, WA. She has been teaching Tagalog for 7 years to a highly specialized group in the military who are being assigned to the Philippines. Ester is also a Medical, Social Services, and Court-Certified Tagalog Interpreter in several counties in the Seattle area. She holds a B.S. Degree in Business Administration from the Philippines.
- Jay Loyola has created dance pieces performed by cultural groups in the Philippines, Asia and Europe. His dance method have garnered respect form his peers as he emerged as the Bay Area's ingenious dance practitioner with choreographies motivated through immersions in Philippine indigenous tribes. He has significantly contributed to Bay Area's multicultural landscape by performances at major venues such as Palace of Fine Arts, and Cowell Theater as well as festival events like San Francisco Ethnic Festival, Pistahan Festival, and Filipino-American Arts Exposition.
- Crisanta Malig is one of the Bay Area's most recognized and multi-awarded haute couture. She founded the Fashion Arts and Youth Enterprise dedicated to help emerging fashion artists realize their dreams and develop their artistic abilities. She did her first designs at an early age of 5.
- \bullet Oscar Penaranda has a B.A. in Literature and an M.A. in Creative Writing from San Francisco State University. He has taught at Everett Middle School and James Logan High School in Union City and also teaches Tagalog to second-generation Filipinos. His studies on Filipino Heritage have spurred him to lead the Filipino American Historical Society and the Filipino American Educators Association of California. Oscar is a published author of two books: Seasons by the Bay and Full Deck.
- Ron Quesada has a bachelor's degree in Ethnomusicology and ten years experience in music instruction. He specializes in Filipino music from across the archipelago but is most known for playing the guitar and the kulintang gongs from the Southern Philippines. He first started earning the diverse repertoire of Filipino music performing with the Haranistas de Manila Rondalla, then went also went deeper into kulintang music with Palabuniyan Kulintang Ensemble. He collaborates frequently with other artists and creates aiming to bring Filipino music to a global audience.
- Cocoy Ventura graduated with honors from Guam Community College with an Associate of Science degree in Hotel Operations. He pursued an undergraduate degree in International Business at Cornell University and graduated with honors, He was also granted a private scholarship to pursue Specialized Training in patisserie in New York's French Culinary Institute. In 2007, he was awarded a Certified Executive Chef title, designated by the American Culinary Federation.
